Complete 15 of these home learning activities this half term to receive a postcard home! (All 10 red and 5 black)

Activities in red are essential and must be completed.

Read a book about Egypt or Ancient Egypt (recorded in reading record).	Set up your own shop using items in your house, with prices for your items. Ask an adult to buy something from your shop so you can practise giving them change (if you haven't got physical money, practice calculating the change).	Science: make 5 different shadow puppets with your hands.	History: build your own pyramid using whatever material you like!
Read a library book to an adult (recorded in reading record).	(Wait until you've learned about time in maths!) Use an analogue clock to tell the time at 5 different points in the day. Write down the times you tell.	Art: create a design for an Egyptian death mask, suitable for a very rich pharaoh.	PE: write a diary about what you've learned so far at our swimming lessons.
Read your favourite non-fiction text, e.g. non-fiction book, newspaper, magazine (recorded in reading record).	Spend 40 minutes in any game-play mode on Times Tables Rockstars.	Computing: go for a walk in your local area and look out for the images you see on road signs. Take some photos of them, or draw some when you get back home. How clear are they?	PSHE: what is your best talent? Perform a talent show for your family.
Read to your favourite toys as if they are your class! (recorded in reading record).	Challenge Miss Rogers on Times Tables Rockstars.	English: create a non-chronological report about Mousehole in Cornwall.	Music: listen to some jazz music. What is your favourite jazz song? Think about what time of year we might hear jazz music the most.
Read a true story - I can recommend some if you get stuck for ideas! (recorded in reading record).	Complete the ultimate times table challenge given to you by Miss Moore.	RE: we know that Sikhs join the Khalsa when baptised. Research what happens in other religions' baptism ceremonies.	Summertime: write down the time the sun sets once a week. What do you notice?
